High Holiday Services

Please note: All services this year will be online. Please sign up at https://bethelmc.org/bethelhhd to receive Zoom information and access to our High Holiday virtual lobby, where you will be able to access all High Holiday services and virtual experiences.

Main Service in Beth El Bender Sanctuary

The service will be live streamed through our High Holiday virtual lobby. The Conservative movement's High Holiday prayerbook, *Machzor Lev Shalem*, is used.

Kol Haneshama

Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur (through the end of Musaf)

The service will be live streamed through our High Holiday virtual lobby. A mix of tradition and innovation, music, and ideas. This year, Rabbi Emeritus Bill Rudolph and Gail Fribush are joining Sid Getz and Sharon Fine in organizing and conducting the services. There will be specially recorded music from Marak Hayom, as well as pre-recorded music from other sources. The pre-recorded music will include musical instruments.

Beth El Family Services (K-5th grades)

These services are designed to be intergenerational, bringing the entire family together for stories, songs, and prayers that elevate the themes of the High Holidays. This year we will also be including video clips from "special guest" musicians, as well as a live shofar service and Torah reading.

Junior Congregation

The Junior Congregation High Holiday services is geared for 5th-7th graders and will include elements of the traditional High Holiday services, Torah portions, and some discussion.

Nitzanim

All families with young children (up through age 6) are invited to join our Nitzanim services. The services are approximately a half hour long and geared toward engaging young children.



High Holiday Seminar

Join Rabbi Harris in dialogue with Reverend Sari Ateek from St. John's Episcopal Church during Yom Kippur as they explore concepts of social justice in their respective faith traditions.

Teen Discussions

All post-b'nai mitzvah youth are encouraged to attend one of the main services listed. In addition, they are invited to discuss themes of the High Holidays with members of Beth El Religious School's Upper School faculty at approximately 11:00 am on both days of Rosh Hashanah and on Yom Kippur.

Ma'ariv and Meditation

In addition to the regular Rosh Hashanah evening services at 7:00 pm on Saturday, September 19, we are continuing Ma'ariv and Meditation. We will have a second chance to look back, look within, and settle ourselves on the path of spiritual renewal.

Tashlich

Rabbi Werbin will conduct a Tashlich service on the second day of Rosh Hashanah, Sunday, September 20, at 4:30 pm. We will meet at the big NIH field entrance by Glenwood and Maple Ridge Road, behind Beth El. Please wear a mask and respect social distancing guidelines. Space is limited.
