

## HEAD COVERINGS

Jewish and non-Jewish males must wear a head covering while they are in the synagogue. Jewish and non-Jewish females must wear a head covering when they are on the bimah. Nonbinary or Gender non-conforming people may choose their individual practice given the guidelines for males and females.

Many families choose to order custom kippot inscribed with the name of the B-Mitzvah child, the date, etc. This adds a special touch to the service and can become a treasured keepsake for their family and friends.
